

REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL  
CITY OF CALEDONIA, MINNESOTA  
Monday, January 8, 2007

CALL TO ORDER: Following due call and notice thereof, Mayor Morey called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Room, City Hall.

ROLL CALL: Members present: Mayor Michael J. Morey; Council Members Paul Fisch, Randi Vick, Gary Klug and Robert Standish. Members absent: None. Consultants and City staff present: Michael Gerardy, Stephanie Mann, and Robert L. Nelson. Visitors present: Steve Bauer, Walter Macomber and Jane Palen, Report.

CLOSED MEETING: At this time, Mayor Morey recessed the Regular Meeting and called a Closed Meeting for a telephone conference with the League of Minnesota Cities appointed consulting attorney Julie Fleming-Wolffe to discuss a claim by a City Employee for wages due and payable. (NOTE: City Council Members and Clerk-Administrator Nelson were the only persons present during the closed meeting. Other city staff and visitors, listed above, arrived after the closed session.) The closed session ended at 7:15 p.m. and Mayor Morey resumed the Regular Meeting.

CONSENT AGENDA: Following brief discussion and corrections of the minutes of the first continued meeting held December 14, a motion was made by Member Klug, seconded by Member Standish, to approve the Consent Agenda items, listed below. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

A. MINUTES OF PAST MEETINGS: Following brief discussion, clarification was made that the minutes of the first continued meeting held December 14 regarding the 2007 Budget for the City of Caledonia did not include changes made during final discussion of the Truth-N-Taxation process and adoption of the budget. Following is the restated paragraph for the 2007 Budget showing the correct amounts.

2007 BUDGET: Following the meeting of December 4, investigation was made of the proposed changes to the draft budget submitted by City Accountant Stephanie Mann with a final tally revealing that the budgeted revenues exceeded expenditures by \$154,280. Based on discussions with department heads and staff since that meeting, recommendations were made to delete the proposed certificate of indebtedness for a revenue amount of \$52,400 and to complete the top portion of the salt shed scheduled for construction in 2007 for an added expense of \$24,000. Other changes included elimination of a generator for an estimated cost of \$5,000 and other miscellaneous changes resulting in a subtotal of approximately ~~\$72,230~~ \$64,328 excess revenues over expenditures. The Council planned that \$50,000 of that amount would be dedicated to the cash deficiency of the General Fund with ~~\$22,230~~ \$14,328 remaining to be allocated to undesignated expenditures.

B. DONATION: Approval of a donation in the amount of \$1,500 from American Legion Post 191 to be passed thru the City to Caledonia Green.

#### VISITORS AND COMMUNICATIONS

A. CITY ACCOUNTANT: Stephanie Mann, Accountant, reviewed the condition of the water and sewer department funds, describing a proposal for rate increases of the base rates and usage rates for each department averaging to an 11% increase for the water rates and 16% increase for the sewer rates. Ms. Mann clarified that the base rates could be adjusted as of the February 1<sup>st</sup> billing, but usage rates, approved and applied at this time would not be collectable until the May 1<sup>st</sup> billing since water meters are read quarterly. Water usage from mid-October through mid-January will be billed on the February, March and April 1<sup>st</sup> billings. Water usage following a rate increase at this time would be used between mid-January and mid-April and billings would reflect the increase on May 1<sup>st</sup>. Following discussion, a motion was made by Member Fisch, seconded by Mayor Morey, to implement the rate increases for water and sanitary sewer as outlined by Ms. Mann, increasing the base rate as of February 1, 2007 and increasing the usage rate on the billing of May 1, 2007. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

#### B. ADMINISTRATIVE COORDINATOR TOPICS:

1. ELECTRIC DEPARTMENT GARAGE CONSTRUCTION: Mike Gerardy, Administrative Coordinator and Steve Bauer, Caledonia Lumber Company, reviewed a Change Order for construction of the City Electric Department Garage. Because of a change in concrete wall elevation, additional materials are required for the superstructure, including extra labor charges for installation of

those materials. In addition, a decision was made by the City to install 10 windows for natural lighting, the grand total of the change order being \$5,237.37. Following discussion and explanation, a motion was made by Member Standish, seconded by Member Fisch, to approve the Change Order for the total amount of \$5,237.37. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

- 2. **ELECTRIC DEPARTMENT GARAGE CONSTRUCTION – WINTER SUSPENSION:** Mr. Gerardy and Mr. Bauer explained the disadvantages of continuing construction at this time, since the concrete contractor had been unable to complete his work. Soil conditions are undesirable, being saturated and frozen. Until base materials are thoroughly dried and compacted, there is fear for pouring a concrete floor. Mr. Bauer stated that this bid for the superstructure work was calculated on the premise that the concrete floor would be fully installed when he began working on the superstructure. If the floor is not installed, he will request a Change Order based on additional labor and hauling expense for assembly of certain frame work off site and delivery to the project site. Following discussion, a motion was made by Member Fisch, seconded by Member Klug, to suspend the project for the winter season until weather was suitable for reasonable completion of the project, when a notice to start work would be issued to the contractors. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.
- 3. **SAFETY MEETING:** Mr. Gerardy reported that the League of Minnesota Cities is holding a safety meeting on ergonomics and requested authorization for Stephanie Mann and Jessica Kruse to attend for a registration fee of \$15 each, the meeting to be held January 25. A motion was made by Member Vick, seconded by Mayor Morey to authorize the attendance as requested. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.
- 4. **MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS:** Mr. Gerardy reported that the Electric Department staff had inserted the poll bases on STH 44 for the planned streetlights at the intersection of Esch Drive. Upon inspecting the 16 new pole wraps around street lights on West Main Street, 132 bulbs were found missing (stolen).

#### OLD BUSINESS

A. WAGES DUE AND PAYABLE: A motion was made by Mayor Morey, seconded by Member Standish, to authorize consulting attorney Julie Fleming-Wolffe to pursue resolution of the claim for wages in accordance with the plan she outlined to the City Council during the

closed session just after 7:00 p.m. this evening. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

**B. AMBULANCE SERVICE EMPLOYMENT**

1. **JOB DESCRIPTION:** The Council reviewed the draft Job Description for Ambulance Director, making 1 change, being that the person appointed, if not already certified to instructed EMT Classes, become certified within a period of 1 year. A motion was made by Mayor Morey, seconded by Member Vick, to approve the Job Description with the above change; and to authorize advertisement for the employment opportunity for 2 weekly issues in the Caledonia Argus and 1 advertisement each in the Lacrosse Tribune and Houston County News. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.
2. **PROBATIONARY PERIOD:** The Council agreed by general consensus that the probationary period for the appointed ambulance director would be 1 year.
3. **WAGES:** Following discussion, the Council agreed by general consensus that the wage range for the newly appointed director would be between \$800 - \$1,000 per month depending upon qualifications.

**NEW BUSINESS**

**A. CLERK’S OFFICE MACHINES:** The Council reviewed an estimate for 2 computers for a total purchase price, including Minnesota Sales Tax, of \$2,112.90, not including installation charges. The budget estimate for the purchase of 2 computers was \$3,200.00. Following discussion, a motion was made by Member Klug, seconded by Mayor Morey, to authorize the purchase of the 2 new computers for the amount of \$2,112.90 and installation fees. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

**B. CHAMBER OF COMMERCE CONTRIBUTION:** Clerk Nelson reported that last year the City donated \$675 to the Caledonia Area Chamber of Commerce for tourism and advertisement to the City, asking if the Council wished to contribute the same this year and reminding the Council that the 2007 line item budget for contributions and donations was \$3,500. Following discussion, a motion was made by Member Fisch, seconded by Member Klug, to approve a donation to the Caledonia Area Chamber of Commerce in the amount of \$675 to be applied toward tourism and advertisement to the City. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

**C. 2007 POSITIONS / APPOINTMENTS:** Mayor Morey made recommendations for 2007 Positions and Appointments. Following discussion, a motion was made by Mayor Morey, seconded by Member Standish, to approve the 2007 Positions and Appointments as discussed at the meeting. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

D. DONATION: A motion was made by Member Vick, seconded by Member Klug, to accept a \$6,000 contribution from the Caledonia Fire Department Relief Association Gambling Account, received December 18, 2006 and apply it toward purchase of ladder truck equipment as proposed to the Council at the Regular Meeting of December 11. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

E. SEMDC AGREEMENT: Following discussion, a motion was made by Mayor Morey, seconded by Member Vick, to enter into the contract for professional services with the Southeast Minnesota Development Corporation to renew the contracted position for Economic Development Authority Director for an annual fee not to exceed \$32,292, according to the stipulated contract terms. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

**CLERK’S REPORT**

A. SPECIAL MEETING: Clerk Nelson reminded the Council Members of the Special Meeting to be held at 7:00 p.m., Thursday, January 11, 2007, in the Commissioners Room, Houston County Courthouse, to review the Draft Comprehensive Plan with representatives of Houston County, Caledonia Township and Mayville Township.

B. INSURANCE RATE DAT A: Enclosed with the Agenda was a letter from Danielson Insurance Agency and a detailed listing of changes in rates, dividends and coverage from the League of Minnesota Cities Insurance Trust.

C. ANNUAL REPORTS: Enclosed with the Agenda for informational purposes only were copies of annual reports submitted to the State of Minnesota for State Peace Officer Aid and State Fire Aid.

D. LMC SEMINARS: Enclosed with the Agenda were advertisements for LMC Seminars for newly elected or experienced officials.

E. POLICE DEPARTMENT: Enclosed with the Agenda was the Officer Activity List and Officer Activity Summary for December 2006.

F. EMPLOYEE TIME RECORD: Enclosed with the Agenda were Employee Time Records for pay period December 4 – 17 and 18-31, 2006.

G. COUNCIL WAGES: Enclosed with the Agenda was a copy of the Minutes from the July 10, 2006 Regular Meeting when Council Salaries were increased from the amount of \$2,500 to \$3,000 for Mayor and from \$2,300 to \$2,800 for Council Members along with an hourly rate increase from \$5.00 to \$10.00 per hour for meetings with staff and Committee Meetings. Those rates became effective January 1, 2007.

H. RESIGNATION: Mayor Morey shared a copy of his letter of resignation to the Caledonia Ambulance Service as an EMT. The letter was dated December 20, 2006.

ADJOURNMENT: There being no further business before the Council, a motion to adjourn was made by Mayor Morey and seconded by Member Vick. All members voted in favor, the motion was declared carried and the meeting then adjourned at 9:50 p.m. The next Regular Meeting of the City Council is scheduled for 7:00 p.m., Monday, January 22, 2007, in the Council Room, City Hall.
