

REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
CITY OF CALEDONIA, MINNESOTA
Monday, October 8, 2012

CALL TO ORDER: Following due call and notice thereof, Mayor Burns called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Room, City Hall.

ROLL CALL: Members present: Mayor Robert H. Burns; Council Members: Randi Vick, Tom Murphy, Bob Lemke and Paul Fisch. Members Absent: None. City Staff Present: City Clerk/Administrator: Ted Schoonover, Mike Gerardy, Mike Tornstrom. City staff present: City Electrician Matt Blocker, Police Officer Tim Irwin Guests present: Bill Klug, Eric Klug, Pete Molling, Duane Strub, John Klug, Herby Erickson and Caledonia Argus Reporter Clay schuldt.

AGENDA APPROVAL: A motion was by Member Fisch, seconded by member Vick to approve the agenda with the following additions: Item 7. (h) Payment to DAVY Engineering Inc, 7. (i) Building height limits, 7. (j) New agenda format, 7. (k) Develop new fund within the general fund for the ambulance fund, 7. (l) Snow plow. Change 7 (f) add missing meter. All members present in favor and the motion was declared carried.

CONSENT AGENDA: A motion was made by Mayor burns, seconded by Member Lemke to approve the consent agenda. All members present in favor and the motion was declared carried.

MINUTES OF PAST MEETING: Minutes were read and stand as read.

VISITORS AND COMMUNICATIONS: None.

ADMINISTRATIVE COORDINATOR TOPICS:

- a. Motion by Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Lemke to approve Change Order # 3 for the Sanitary Sewer Project in the amount of \$ 5,410.00. All members present in favor and the motion was declared carried.
- b. Motion by Member Murphy, seconded by Member Vick to approve the change in the sewer project and repave N. Pine St. from the North lift station to the South where the road was removed. The four Council persons present voted in favor, the Mayor abstained from the vote and the motion was declared carried.
- c. PUBLIC HEARING 6:05 p.m. – The regular meeting was closed and the Council went into a public hearing to discuss a variance request from Bill and Claire Klug. Mr. Klug asked if the city had plans in the future to place electrical service to the front of the properties. Mayor Burns stated that was the intent but a time frame had not been established. Administrative Coordinator Mike Gerardy stated that the Klugs were requesting a 5’ setback variance on the East side of their property and a 3’ setback variance to the East side of the existing easement. The second would be a direct violation of City Ordinance 208 which requires 5’. The adjoining property owners have no issues with the request. At 6:15 p.m. the Mayor closed the public hearing and reconvened the regular meeting. Motion by Vick, seconded by Murphy to deny the variance request. The Mayor called for a roll call vote: Yes: Member Fisch, Member Murphy, Member Vick,. No: Mayor Burns, Member Lemke. The motion to deny carried.
- d. PUBLIC HEARING 6:25 p.m. – The regular meeting was closed and the Council went into a public hearing to discuss a variance request from Duane Strub and Pete Molling. Pete Molling explained that he has plans to purchase the property and needs additional space to expand his business. The property is zoned Industrial and there are no residential properties in close proximity. Administrative Coordinator Mike Gerardy stated they are asking for a 21’ setback variance on the South side of the property and a 30” setback variance on the West side of the property. Unless the two parcels are combined they will not meet the 20,000 square foot limits by Ordinance. Mr. Molling stated he intended to combine the parcels so size would not be an issue. At 6:35 p.m. the Mayor closed the public hearing and reconvened regular meeting. Motion by Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Lemke to approve the variance as requested. The Mayor called for a roll call vote. Yes: Mayor Burns, Member Fisch, Member Murphy, Member Vick, Member Lemke. No: None. The motion was declared carried.
- e. B-1 Central Business District. Administrative Coordinator Mike Gerardy stated a resident had requested to see if a Bed and Breakfast with food service would be allowed within the this district and he wanted clarification from the council to ensure that it would be considered the same as a hotel/motel which are allowed. The consensus of the council was they were that same and they would be taxed just like the Fairbridge Motel or any other lodging facility. No action was taken.

- f. Administrative Coordinator Mike Gerardy informed the council that as of close of business today they had approximately 79 meters to replace. Clerk-Administrator Schoonover stated the contractor estimated that they anticipated 20-30 will not be completed. The main reason was they have many residents that have not responded to the door hangings, phone calls et set era. The contractor told Schoonover that other cities have sent letters to those non compliant residents threatening to shut off services others have set fines. The council directed Clerk-Administrator Schoonover to draft a letter informing the non compliant residents that thier service will be terminated on October 24, 2012 if they do not comply. The letters will be delivered by Peace Officers and if no reply by certified mail.
- g. Administrator Coordinator Mike Gerardy informed the council that a resident at 607 Winnebago St. apparently removed his previous water meter and hard plumbed in his water line. The contractor attempted to retrieve the old meter but the resident stated he did not have it. The council felt that this was a criminal act and to have the Clerk-Administrator hand it over to the City Attorney for possible legal action.
- h. Motion by Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Fisch to approve Change Order # 4 to Dakota Supply Group in the amount of \$3,302.66. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.
- i. Motion by Member Fisch, seconded by Member Vick to approve Payment Request #2 to Griffin Construction Company in the amount of \$90,270.43. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.
- j. The Mayor asked Administrative Coordinator Mike Gerardy if the height requirement in the industrial area was 40' and asked to look at Sno-Pac as it appears to be in excess of that height. Gerardy stated it was indeed 40' and he would check into the matter.
- k. The Mayor asked if it would be possible to develop and implement an Ordinance that could deal with homes in disrepair and dilapidated. Clerk-Administrator Schoonover informed the council he would check with other cities and prepare something for the next meeting.
- l. Administrative Coordinator Gerardy stated that the snow plow is ready to be picked up, Member Lemke stated he was available to pick it up. Motion by Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Fisch to reimburse Member Lemke for fuel and expenses. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

- a. Motion by Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Lemke to approve the prepaid claims for September as presented to include the ones received this evening. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

- c. Ambulance Director Mike Tornstrom was present and asked the council to allow three of his EMT to attend an instructor course in Austin. The course would require and overnight stay and he asked if the EMTs could be paid for the training. He estimated that the total cost would be less than \$1,800.00 and that they could get that back by holding their own training once they are certified. Motion by Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Fisch to allow the three EMTs to attend the training and reimburse them for lodging and pay them for the 18 hours of classes. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.
- d. Motion by Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Lemke to approve the extension of the 2012 Electrical Project until November 2, 2012. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.
- e. Motion by Member Fisch, seconded by Member Vick to approve Resolution 15-2012 Joint Agreement between the City of Caledonia and the State of Minnesota. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

RESOLUTION 15-2012

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF A CONTINUATION OF A JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF CALEDONIA, MN AND THE STATE OF MINNESOTA,

ACTING THROUGH ITS DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND THE BUREAU OF CRIMINAL APPREHENSION

WHEREAS, the Caledonia Police Department originally entered into a Joint Powers Agreement with the State of Minnesota through its Commissioner of Public Safety and the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension to investigate and combat the exploitation of children through the use of computers;

Now therefore, this Joint Powers Agreement is being renewed to cover the 1 June 2012 – 31 May 2013,

The Caledonia City Council is now hereby authorizing the City of Caledonia Mayor, City Administrator and Chief of Police to execute the continuation of the Joint Powers Agreement on behalf of the Caledonia Police Department.

- f. Clerk-Administrator Schoonover informed the council that the State of Minnesota has changed the way that fire fighter training is billed and invoiced. The state will now pay directly to the vendor and the city does not have to do the voucher system and get reimbursed.
- g. Clerk-Administrator Schoonover informed the board that back in August there was a wind storm that caused a tree limb to fall onto a electrical service and pulling it from the home. The tree was in the city Right of Way but deemed to be healthy. Because it was considered an act God the home owner should be liable to pay for the reinstallation of services. Schoonover stated he will send the owner a letter asking for payment. If payment cannot be made the owner has the option of a special assessment.
- h. Motion by Member Fisch, seconded by Member Murphy to approve Resolution 16-2012 Intent to Terminate Pole Agreement with Mediacom. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.
