

REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL  
CITY OF CALEDONIA, MINNESOTA  
Monday, December 14, 2009

CALL TO ORDER: Following due call and notice thereof, Mayor Burns called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Room, City Hall.

ROLL CALL: Members present: Mayor Robert H. Burns; Council Members: Randi Vick, Peggy Perry, Robert Lemke and Tom Murphy. Members absent: None. Consultants and City staff present: Mike Gerardy, Stephanie Mann, Mike Tornstrom, Kris Buege, Mark Schiltz and Richard Fursman. Visitors present: Paul Weichert, Greg Weichert and Charlie Warner, Report.

AGENDA APPROVAL: There were no addition or deletions to the Agenda; therefore a motion was made by Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Perry to approve the Agenda. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

CONSENT AGENDA: A motion was made by Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Vick, to approve the Consent Agenda items, listed below. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

A. MINUTES OF PAST MEETINGS: To approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting held Monday, November 23, 2009; Special Meeting held Monday, December 7, 2009 and Continued Meeting held Thursday, December 10, 2009, as presented.

B. TOBACCO LICENSES: Consideration for approval of Tobacco Licenses to Kraus Oil, Kwik Trip and Quillin's IGA.

C. LIQUOR LICENSES: Consideration for approval of the Intoxicating Liquor Licenses for the following businesses: Good Times Bar & Grill, Elsie's Bar & Grill, The Ranch, Starlite Bowling Center and the American Legion Club; Contingent upon applicants meeting all legal requirements including local and state laws.

VISITORS AND COMMUNICATIONS

A. THE BRIMEYER GROUP: Mr. Richard Fursman, President, The Brimeyer Group, discussed with the Council the candidate profile brochure that his company prepared for the hiring of a new city clerk for Caledonia. He requested the Council clarify the salary range, which after discussion it was set at \$60,000 to \$75,000. Mr. Fursman indicated to the Council that the dates for interviews would be February 8<sup>th</sup> at a Regular Council Meeting and following that the top 5 candidates and spouses would be in town February 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> to again meet with the Council and that all meetings would be publicized as special meetings so that the public could attend. The Council indicated they would pay for all meals during those two days along with one night lodging. Following discussion, a motion was made by Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Lemke, to set the salary range from \$60,000 to \$75,000, and to approve paying for all meals and lodging. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

B. CITY ACCOUNTANT

1. AMBULANCE DEPARTMENT: Mike Tornstrom, Director, was present to discuss the purchase of 3 new computers, called tough books, for both ambulances & an extra one. He explained these computers would be hooked up to the MNSTAR system for recording calls, that way attendants can fill out the reports online, therefore eliminating a tremendous amount of paperwork. These computers were a budgeted item for 2009. Mr. Tornstrom further explained that they had received an Arlin Faulk Grant in the amount of \$6,400 and he is asking the City to pay the remaining balance of \$9,000; being the total for all computers is approximately \$15,000. After brief discussion and review of the ambulance department 2009 budget worksheet, a motion was made by Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Perry, to approve the purchase of three tough book computers. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.
2. 2010 BUDGET: Stephanie Mann, Accountant, presented the updated calculations for the 2010 budget numbers, following the Continued Meeting on December 10<sup>th</sup>. Ms. Mann presented a total of \$114,008 for the capital item expenditures that were approved for the 2010 budget. After brief discussion of the changes for the 2010 general fund budget, a motion was made by Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Perry, to approve the 2010 general fund budget with revenues totaling \$1,894,786 and expenditures of \$1,833,353 leaving a surplus of \$61,433.

Members voting in favor: Burns, Perry, Vick, Lemke and Murphy. The motion was declared carried.

3. 2009 TAX LEVY, COLLECTIBLE IN 2010: Mayor Burns recessed the regular meeting and open the public hearing to discuss the 2009 Tax Levy. Ms. Mann presented the final changes to the 2010 general fund budget, which included the full proposed levy of 20.71%. Mayor Burns opened the floor to any comments from citizens. Greg Weichert had questions on his City portion of the tax that was considerably more than the proposed. After discussion, the Council determined that his property was not homesteaded and that he would have to take his notice to the assessors' office to inquire on the change. Gary Klug expressed his concern in regards to the large increase and the effect it will have on the elderly and those who have fixed incomes. With their being no more testimony from citizens, Mayor Burns closed the public hearing and resumed the regular meeting, whereupon the Council reviewed various grafts that compared the City of Caledonia to other cities in the area, showing their tax rates and levy per capita. Lengthy discussion was also held regarding the possibility of further cuts of Local Government Aid in 2010. Following discussion, a motion was made by Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Murphy, to approve the 2010 tax levy of \$627,363, which is an increase of 20.71%. Members voting in favor: Burns, Murphy, Vick, Perry and Lemke. The motion was declared carried.
4. NON – ASSOCIATION WAGES: The wage committee consisting of Member Perry and Member Murphy recommended to the full council that no wage increases be given to non association or part time employees, with the exception that Stephanie Mann, City Accountant, would get the 70¢ per hour raise in 2010 just like other city employees of the City of Caledonia Employee Association would be getting for 2010. After brief discussion a motion was made by Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Lemke, to approve the recommendation from the Wage Committee that no wage increases be given in 2010, with the exception of Ms. Mann. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.
5. LETTER – DAVID DROWN ASSOCIATES: As requested by the Council, a letter from Shannon Sweeney, David Drown Associates was distributed to the Council. The letter was Mr. Sweeney's summary of the financial status of the City of Caledonia.

A. PREPAID CLAIMS: Following review, discussion and deliberation, a motion was made by Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Vick, to approve the Prepaid Claims List for November 2009. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried

**OLD BUSINESS**

A. **COMPUTER UPGRADE:** Interim Clerk Mike Gerardy explained to the Council that \$300 had been budgeted in 2009 for a RAM upgrade to his computer in the Administrative Coordinator’s Office and he would like that installed at this time. Following brief discussion, a motion was made by Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Vick, to approve the purchase of the computer RAM for a cost not to exceed \$300. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

B. **CONSERVATION IMPROVEMENT PLAN:** Member Murphy presented to the Council his draft of the CIP Plan he has put together and explained the highlights of the plan to be adopted by January 1, 2010. Member Murphy asked the Council to review the plan and bring forth any suggestions or questions to the next regular meeting. He also suggested changes can be made as the time passes but this would be the initial plan for adoption. Following review, a motion was made by Member Lemke, seconded by Member Perry, to adopt the Conservation Improvement Plan. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

**NEW BUSINESS**

A. **CONSULTING FEE:** Mr. Gerardy stated to the Council that he would like to set a consulting fee for retired City Clerk Bob Nelson. Since his Retirement City staff has called upon him for his knowledge of past dealings with the City and Gerardy felt it would be appropriate that he would be paid for his time. After brief discussion, motion made by Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Murphy to put Bob Nelson’s rate of pay at \$30 per hour. Gerardy would keep track of Nelson’s time and we would pay him after January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2010 for 2009 time spent. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

B. **CONTRACTED SERVICES:** Mr. Gerardy asked the Council to set a wage for any persons that would be assisting in the snow hauling operations when snow removal was done in the downtown area. After brief discussion, a motion was made by Member Perry, seconded by Member Murphy, to set a pay rate of \$10 per hour for people driving city equipment and assisting with snow removal operations. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

C. **POLICY FOR NON – ASSOCIATION MEMBERS OVERTIME HOURS:** Gerardy suggested to the Council that a policy should be set for non association employees overtime hours. He reminded the Council that this topic came up at another council meeting when council members were reviewing timesheets and noticed that overtime was paid after 8 hours for part time non association employees. Mr. Gerardy stated that upon his research he found that there is nothing that addresses part time people not in association agreements. Therefore the Council would need to set a policy for rate of pay for part time non association members, according to his findings, part time annual employees would be paid over time after 40 hours of work in any given week. Any part time seasonal employees or students such as in the park and recreation and pool area, they would receive overtime after 48 hours of work in any given week. After brief discussion, a motion was made by Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Lemke, to set a policy to pay overtime after 40 hours of work in any given week for non association employees and after 48 hours of work in any given week to seasonal employees, further that this policy would be in place as of January 1, 2010. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

D. **WATER LEVEL DETECTOR FOR CITY WELLS:** Tony Klug, Water / Waste Water Superintendent, requests authorization to purchase a second water level detector, so that each well could have there own. According to the new water conservation plan that was accepted by

the MN DNR, one of their specific requirements was that the water in each well be monitored and recorded monthly, versus annually, therefore it would be more appropriate to have water level detector in each well rather than pulling it up each time and moving it from well to well, which would be time consuming when they were over 500 feet. After brief discussion, a motion was Mayor Burns, seconded by Member Lemke, to purchase a second water level detector. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

E. INSURANCE CHANGES FOR 2010: The Council reviewed a letter from Tom Danielson, Danielson Insurance Agency, defining the league's most recent letter regarding the changes of insurance coverage for the City of Caledonia.

#### CLERK'S REPORT

A. LIQUOR STORE: Patty Gavin, Manager, informed Mr. Gerardy that she will be on medical leave for 6 to 8 weeks and wanted to inform the Council that she asked Rhonda Oesterle a former employee of the liquor store to come and work. Rhonda Oesterle accepted and she will be helping out at the liquor store for an extended period of time.

B. EMPLOYEE TIME RECORD: Enclosed with the Agenda was the Employee Time Record for pay period November 16 – 29, 2009.

C. POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORTS: Enclosed with the Agenda was the Officer Activity List and Officer Activity Summary for the month of November.

D. DISCHARGE MONITORING REPORT: Enclosed with the Agenda was the Discharge Monitoring Report, showing a Total Monthly Average Nitrogen Level of 4.69 mg/l.

E. 2010 ELECTRICAL PROJECT: Gerardy reminded that we should start working on it again for the 2010 season.

F. COUNCIL MEETING: After discussion, the Mayor commented that the meeting would not be held unless a matter came into City Hall that had to be dealt with before the end of the year.

G. METER READING EQUIPMENT: Gerardy presented a request from the meter readers to purchase some gators which would water proof their pants from the knees down so that dredging through the snow they do not get soaking wet. Approximate estimate was \$30 per pair. The Council agreed by general consensus to purchase three pairs for meter readers.

#### MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

A. CIP PLAN: Mayor Burns suggested that when the Conversation Improvement Plan would be adopted, the City may be able to run an ad in the Caledonia Argus notifying residents of the plan and some of its requirements or language for rebates.

ADJOURNMENT: There being no further business before the Council, a motion to adjourn was made by Member Vick and seconded by Mayor Burns. All members voted in favor, the motion was declared carried and the meeting then adjourned at 9:02 p.m. The next Regular Meeting of the City Council is scheduled for 6:00 p.m., Monday, January 11, 2010, in the Council Room, City Hall.
