

REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
CITY OF CALEDONIA, MINNESOTA
Monday, August 13, 2007

CALL TO ORDER: Following due call and notice thereof, Mayor Morey called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Room, City Hall.

ROLL CALL: Members present: Mayor Michael J. Morey; Council Members: Paul Fisch, Randi Vick, Gary Klug and Robert Standish. Members absent: None. Consultants and City staff present: Michael Gerardy and Robert L. Nelson. Visitors present: Brad Jilek, Peggy Purcell, Ann Thompson, Willie Hoskins, Janice Kutina and Charles Warner, Reporter.

CONSENT AGENDA: Following brief discussion, a motion was made by Member Vick, seconded by Member Standish, to approve the Consent Agenda Items, listed below. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

A. MINUTES OF PAST MEETINGS: To approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting held Monday, July 23, 2007, as presented.

B. APPLICATION FOR EXEMPT PERMIT: To approve an Application for Exempt Permit submitted by St. Mary's Parish to conduct a gambling event to include bingo, raffles and pull tabs at St. Mary's School, 308 East South Street, on October 28, 2007, and to waive the waiting period.

VISITORS AND COMMUNICATIONS

A. NOISE COMPLAINT: Peggy Purcell, 116 North Hokah Street, complained about the noise from baseball batting practice conducted at Miken Sports at the address of 315 West Lincoln Street. She reported that the activity has been going on for years and is sometimes continuous from 6:30 a.m. to 1:00 a.m. the following morning. On hot summer days the building doors are left open which increases the intensity of the noise, which is still noticeable even when the doors are closed. She reported she called the manager on July 5 and was told that within 30 days there would be improvements to the building to deaden the sound and install air conditioning which would then enable the occupants to close the door. She reports that the door is still open and if any sound deadening work was performed it was of no value. She reported that although there was some noise from the previous owner, Pieper Plumbing, which was only on an occasional basis. This owner with the constant batting practice and pinging of the composite bats on balls thrown from the pitting machines entirely altered the character of the neighborhood. Clerk Nelson said the City would solicit testimony from other neighbors and take decibel readings at the site to determine the level of noise intensity.

B. ADMINISTRATIVE COORDINATOR TOPICS

1. GENERATOR BID: Michael Gerardy, Administrative Coordinator, opened bids received for wiring a permanent generator into the City Hall, Fire Barn and City Auditorium. Two bids were received. The bid from Hoskins Electric was \$41,040. The bid from P & T Electric was \$60,480. Following the opening and brief discussion, Mayor Morey announced that Mr. Gerardy should review all aspects of the bid in comparison to the specifications and re-present the bids at the next regular meeting for a council decision.
2. ELECTRIC DEPARTMENT GARAGE WIRING BIDS: Mr. Gerardy opened bids for wiring the new electric department garage reporting the bid of P & T Electric at \$20,112. Brad's Electric at \$19,390 and Hoskins Electric at \$16,123. Following discussion, a motion was made by Mayor Morey, seconded by Member Klug, to accept the apparent low bid of Hoskins Electric in the amount of \$16,123 contingent upon the accuracy of the bid and enclosure of the required documents per the specifications. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.
3. CONTRACTORS PAYMENT ESTIMATE: Mr. Gerardy presented a partial estimate request from Caledonia Lumber Company for work performed on the electric department garage in the amount of \$48,067.20, explaining the work performed for that amount. Following discussion, a motion was made by Member Standish, seconded by Member Klug, to authorize payment of the contractors' request. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.
4. MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

- a. SOUTH FIFTH STREET: Clerk Nelson reported that a resident on South Fifth Street requested the City consider installing no parking signs on the west side of the street during the Houston County Fair because of the volume of traffic and pedestrians' being that the street becomes extremely narrow when parking is on both sides. Mr. Gerardy and Police Chief Shefelbine agree that limiting parking to one side was a reasonable action to enhance safety. Following discussion, a motion was made by Member Standish, seconded by Member Klug, to prohibit parking on the west side of Fifth Street during the Houston County Fair for the 2007 fair event. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.
- b. WASTE WATER PLANT FENCING: Mr. Gerardy reported that fencing operations were complete around the storage areas of the waste water treatment plant and that this week the contractor would tour the perimeter fence with Mr. Gerardy to inspect apparent holes in that fence.
- c. STREET DEPARTMENT YARD: Mr. Gerardy reported that Meyer Brothers Construction had placed a concrete apron near the street department and electric department shops.
- d. PROPOSED LIGHTING ALONG STH 44/76: In response to an inquiry from Member Fisch, Mr. Gerardy reported that he had submitted an application to install lighting along STH 44/76 to MNDOT in Rochester, but had received no response at this time. He reported that City Electrician Roger Schmitz would like to install at least 3 poles.
- e. SEMI PARKING: Mr. Gerardy reported that semi's are again parking on Industry Road in the industrial park to such extent that it is difficult for semi's of other businesses to pass and turn onto and off Industry Road from their driveways. He proposed installing no semi parking signs on the west side of the road along the area described. Following discussion, a motion was made by Member Standish, seconded by Member Vick, to authorize the installation of no truck parking signs on the referenced area of Industry Road. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

C. POLICE DEPARTMENT EQUIPMENT: Police Chief Randy Shefelbine informed the Council that he would request a new vehicle or SUV for the Police Department to be purchased in 2008. He said if the Council had no objections he would prepare specifications for a vehicle which would most likely not be fabricated and arrive until calendar year 2008. Further, he said he would like to start an eligibility list for a police officer since he expected Officer Logan to give notice of his resignation sometime in or after October 2007. He said Officer Logan plans marriage in October and moving to Rochester.

D. REQUEST REDUCTION OF LIQUOR LICENSE FEES: Janice Kutina, Starlite Bowling Center, requested the Council to consider decreasing the amount of Liquor License Fees. The regular Liquor License Fee is \$1,500 and the Sunday License is \$100. She said that the City of Eitzen charges only \$800 and the license fee for the Spring Grove American Legion Club is only \$450. The council agreed to take a survey of other communities' liquor licensing fees and consider the issue when the budget for 2008 was reviewed and adopted by the City this fall.

OLD BUSINESS

A. ZONING APPLICATION – PAULETTE LAWSON: Clerk Nelson recommended that the application of Paulette Lawson to build a two story home and two attached garages on the same parcel as her manufactured home be denied on the basis that the zoning ordinance anticipates one primary building, one garage and one utility shed on a parcel of land. Since the City recently was informed that the manufactured home was not a non conforming use and could remain on the property indefinitely, being maintained to any level, there was no projection for its removal as was contended when the proposal for the two story home with two attached garages was presented to the council. Following discussion, a motion was made by Member Vick, seconded by Mayor Morey, to deny the request for a two story home with two attached garages for the facts stated earlier. Members voting in favor: Morey, Fisch, Vick and Klug. Opposed: Standish. The motion was declared carried.

B. HOUSTON COUNTY CJC: Clerk Nelson said the City would re-advertise for a Public Hearing to consider revised plans for placement of the CJC along the east side of the property, adjacent to Pine Street and install parking lots throughout the entire courthouse square parcel. There would also be new advertisement for vacating the two street segments; Marshall Street and Washington Street. Nelson reported that, among issues discussed, however, was that the City would agree to accept the advertisement for parking stall number and dimensions based upon the original advertisement. Ann Thompson, Houston County Commissioner, informed the Council that there were 129 employees, counting the commissioners, for Houston County and that there were from 79 to 108 parked cars in lots and on streets around the county courthouse according to counts conducted 2 times per day. Member Standish commented that he had a conversation with Fire Chief Chuck Gavin who said that the plans should be reviewed by the State Fire Marshall's Office for comment. Member Standish further commented that Chief Gavin said there would not be sufficient water for fighting a fire should the proposed criminal justice center and courthouse burn at the same time. Member Fisch commented that the most recent illustration for layout of the property showed almost no grass left around the courthouse square. He said for residential properties in the R-2 District only 25% of the rear yard was eligible for development or improvement with buildings. Commissioner Thompson asked that the City contact the County Commissioners when they are ready for another meeting to discuss the CJC. Commissioner Thompson said with regard to locating the facility off site on the end of town that a far greater area of land would be purchased for the purpose than what had been purchased to construct the CJC in the downtown area. No action was taken by the Council at this time.

C. COMPENSATION STUDY: Clerk Nelson asked if the Council wished to have any further presentations by Paul Ness, Consultant for Pay Equity and other issues, following the review of the analysis enclosed with the agenda? By general consensus, the council determined it was not prepared to make a decision at this time, but would study the issue further.

NEW BUSINESS

A. TELEPHONE PLAN: Clerk Nelson reviewed the telephone plan outlined by a representative of Ace Link showing a proposal which could save the City approximately \$57 per month on its long distance and local combined calls. Following brief discussion, a motion was made by Member Fisch, seconded by Member Standish, to approve the new plan for the proposed reduction of costs. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

B. MINNESOTA MUNICIPAL UTILITIES ASSOCIATION: Clerk Nelson reviewed the request to designate voting delegates to MMUA Meetings. Following discussion, the Council designated the arraignment of voting members to be Matt Blocker, Roger Schmitz, Michael Gerardy, Michael Morey, Mayor and Robert L. Nelson, Clerk – Administrator. A motion was made by Mayor Morey, seconded by Member Fisch, to establish that priority for MMUA Meetings. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

C. LIQUOR LICENSE: Clerk Nelson informed the Council that Elmer and Beverly Rud intend to sell their business to Elsie Vesterse with Joe Rud leasing the bar. His current plan, along with Elsie's is to continue operating under the name of Sonny & Bev's Bar and Grill, the new owners intend to take over on August 27. Clerk Nelson explained that the prorated value of the liquor license for the months of September – December was \$533. While the council may have authorization to charge the full liquor license fees, the few times bars have changed hands in the past, Nelson reported that the council only charged the prorated amount for the remainder of the year. That amount was then reimbursed to the seller. Following discussion, a motion was made by Member Fisch, seconded by Member Standish, to issue a liquor license and Sunday liquor license to Joe Rud for a prorated fee of \$533 for the period of August 27 – December 31, 2007. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

D. COACHING WAGES: Brief discussion was held on a volunteer coaching position staffed by Robert Ekern, Brownsville for a total of 56 hours over the summer period for coaching a girl's softball team. Clerk Nelson explained that Mr. Ekern had volunteered last summer for assisting the full time coach then volunteered this summer for the same purpose, but circumstances existed which obligated him to attend almost all practice sessions and all out of town games. Primarily to reimburse himself for the use of his personal vehicle with the high cost of gasoline, he is requesting payment for a total of 56 hours. Following discussion, considering there maybe others who would also qualify, the council tabled his request until the next meeting.

E. 2008 HOME SHOW: A motion was made by Member Vick, seconded by Member Fisch, to reserve a booth at the 2008 LaCrosse Home Show for a fee of \$500 which \$250 payable now and the balance payable prior to February 28, 2008. All members voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.
