### Tips For Making Your Scarecrow

--Facial expression of the scarecrow is important, and the first thing a viewer notices. The face can be sad, cheerful, beautiful, ugly, or angry. Masks are permitted.

--Scarecrow head materials can include old milk jugs, flower pots, gourds, wood, basketball, plastic pumpkin, stuffed pillowcase, or burlap.

--Hair can be made from a variety of materials, including yarn, pipe cleaners, shredded plastic, beads, moss, rope, raffia, mop head, or torn fabric.

--Plastic bags make the best stuffing. Newspaper and water-soluble peanuts are not recommended because they do not hold up in wet weather.

--Accessories make the difference! Add hats, gloves, shoes, a scarf and other props.
