## REGULAR MEETING OF THE CALEDONIA CITY COUNCIL CITY COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL CALEDONIA, MINNESOTA Monday, December 12, 2016

CALL TO ORDER: Following due call and notice thereof, Mayor Gran called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Room of City Hall.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Mayor Gran led the Council, City staff, and visitors in stating the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL: Council members present: Mayor Joshua Gran, Robert Burns, Paul Fisch, Robert Lemke, and DeWayne Schroeder. City staff present: Stephanie Mann, accountant; Adam Swann, clerk-administrator. Visitor(s) present: Randi Vick, councilmember-elect.

AGENDA: Member Burns moved to approve the agenda; the motion was seconded by Member Fisch. All members present voted in favor to approve the agenda, and the agenda was approved.

CONSENT AGENDA APPROVAL: Member Fisch moved to approve the consent agenda. Member Burns seconded the motion. All members present voted in favor of the motion, and the motion passed. The consent agenda comprised the following items:

- b. Approval of training request from Craig Nelson to attend MRWA technical conference

- e. Approval of MN Dept. of Commerce utility deposit interest rate (.8%) for deposits with Caledonia Electric Department
- f. Approval of licenses for Quillin's IGA, Kraus Oil, Kwik Trip #733, and Dollar General to purchase or sell cigarettes or tobacco products
- g. Approval of applications from Lee Babler (d/b/a Elsie's), Well Tomorrow, Inc. (d/b/a Good Times Pizza & Bar), MAAD Alley, LLC, and Richard Schulze (d/b/a The Ranch) for 2017 on-sale intoxicating liquor licenses and on-sale Sunday intoxicating liquor licenses
- Approval of application from American Legion 191 (d/b/a American Legion Club) for 2017 club on-sale liquor license and Sunday intoxicating liquor license. Approval of application from The Wired Rooster, LLC (d/b/a The Wired Rooster Coffee Shoppe) for 2017 on-sale wine license
- i. Approval of request from Ali Jennings for key to Municipal Auditorium
- j. Approval of gambling permit for Caledonia Wrestling Club

## PUBLIC COMMENT: None.

## CLERK-ADMINISTRATOR:

a. <u>Updates</u>: Clerk-Administrator Swann reported the following: (i) he, Jessica Kohnen (utility billing clerk), and Matt Blocker (line foreman) would be meeting later in the week with the final two businesses affected by the electric undercharges; (ii) Stephanie Mann was instrumental in helping the Fire Relief Fire

Association submit its report to the Minnesota Office of the State Auditor for its fire state aid by the Nov. 30 deadline; (iii) there were 27 unfulfilled pledges for the Support Our Swimming (SOS) Pool Campaign—in addition to the 3 pledges rescinded—and these 27 donors would be sent a reminder letter next week.

## NEW BUSINESS:

a. <u>City Ordinance 2016-005: Ordinance Amending Chapter 33 of the Caledonia City Code to Affirm</u> the Library Board and Establish the Library Fund: Council reviewed and discussed Ordinance 2016-005, which would amend the City Code to recognize the Library Board and establish a special fund known as the Library Fund, which would be levied separately by the City each year. Swann reported that the ordinance was presented for Council's consideration, in part, because although research indicated the Library Board was formally created and recognized in 1919 and had been in existence since that time, the Library Board was not included in the City Code. Member Fisch moved to approve Ordinance 2016-005, and Member Burns seconded the motion. All members present voted in favor of the motion, and the motion passed.

b. <u>Public hearing regarding 2017 budget and levy (Truth in Taxation)</u>: At 6:18 p.m. the meeting was adjourned to hold a public hearing on the 2017 budget and levy. No citizens or visitors were present who wanted to address the Council. At 6:19 the public hearing was closed, and the regular meeting of the City Council was reconvened.

c. <u>2016 Budget Amendments</u>: Stephanie Mann, city accountant, presented Council with the 2016 budget amendments and estimated the General Fund would have a surplus of \$179,338, which was due in large part to approximately \$97,000 in additional revenues, including a dividend from the League of Minnesota Cities Insurance Trust and additional money from property taxes, forfeitures, court fines, police and fire aid, and the sale of assets. Council reviewed and discussed the budget amendments. Member Burns moved to approve the amendments as presented, and Member Fisch seconded the motion. All members present voted in favor of the motion, and the motion passed.

Member Burns moved to authorize the city accountant to transfer any General Fund surplus in excess of \$25,000 to City Fund 352 (capital improvement fund) on December 30, 2016. Member Fisch seconded the motion. All members present voted in favor of the motion, and the motion passed.

d. <u>Consideration of 2017 budget/levy</u>: Council reviewed the proposed 2017 budget and levy. The proposed General Fund budget was \$1,855,505, and the total proposed levy was \$819,127. By consensus the Council agreed to budget \$29,000 for a new pickup truck for the Police Department and to fund this purchase by transferring \$29,000 from Fund 352 (Capital Improvement Fund) to the General Fund. Mayor Gran moved to add \$15,000 to Streets, Etc.-Labor/Services for additional street repair by removing \$15,000 budgeted in EDA-Labor/Services for a possible senior living market study. The motion failed for lack of a second. Member Burns moved to approve the 2017 budget of \$1,912,930—including transferring \$28,425 from the projected surplus to Fund 352 (Capital Improvement Fund)—with a 0% increase in the levy, as set forth in Resolution 2016-017. Member Fisch seconded the motion. Member Burns requested a roll call vote. Member Burns: YES; Member Fisch: YES; Mayor Gran: YES; Member Lemke: NO; and Member Schroeder: YES. The motion was approved by a vote of 4-1.

e. <u>Operating Engineers Local #49 Health and Welfare Fund Participation Agreement for Bargaining</u> <u>Premium Employees</u> and <u>Operating Engineers Local #49 Health and Welfare Participation Agreement for</u> <u>Non-Bargaining Premium Employees</u>: Council reviewed and discussed the proposed participation agreements the City received from the Operating Engineers Local #49 Health and Welfare Fund. Member Burns moved to approve the participation agreements for the bargaining premium employees and the non-bargaining premium employees. Member Schroeder seconded the motion. All members present voted in favor of the motion, and the motion passed.

f. <u>Overtime reports</u>: Council reviewed the overtime reports for the pay period November 21, 2016 through December 4, 2016. No further action was taken by Council.

e. <u>Prepaid claims</u>: Council reviewed the prepaid claims for the period November 11, 2016-December 9, 2016. Member Burns moved to approve the prepaid claims listed below. The motion was seconded by Member Fisch. All members present voted in favor of the motion, and the motion passed.
