REGULAR MEETING OF THE CALEDONIA CITY COUNCIL CITY COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL CALEDONIA, MINNESOTA Monday, September 12, 2016

CALL TO ORDER: Following due call and notice thereof, Mayor Gran called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Room of City Hall.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Mayor Gran led the Council, City staff, and visitors in stating the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL: Council members present: Mayor Joshua Gran, Robert Burns, Robert Lemke, and DeWayne Schroeder. City staff present: Mike Gerardy, administrative coordinator; Stephanie Mann, accountant; Adam Swann, clerk-administrator, Mike Tornstrom, ambulance director. Visitor(s) present: None.

AGENDA: Councilmember Burns requested that the Council add the following items to the agenda: City Code revisions and purchase of property for Fire Department building. Clerk-Administrator Swann requested that the Council remove two items of unfinished business from the agenda: participation agreements for bargaining premium and non-bargaining premium employees. Member Burns moved to approve the agenda with the requested amendments; the motion was seconded by Member Lemke. All members present voted in favor to approve the agenda with the amendments.

CONSENT AGENDA APPROVAL: Member Lemke moved to approve the consent agenda. Member Schroeder seconded the motion. All members present voted in favor of the motion, and the motion passed. The consent agenda comprised the following items:

- a. Approval of minutes for August 22, 2016 regular meeting
- b. Approval of destruction orders for weeds, grasses, and rank vegetation
- c. Approval of application from Caledonia Lions Club to hold gambling activity on October 23, 2016

PUBLIC COMMENT: None.

CLERK-ADMINISTRATOR:

a. <u>Municipal Auditorium gym usage policy</u>: Swann asked Council for guidance on what activities should be prohibited in the Municipal Auditorium now that the repairs and resurfacing of the gym floor were completed. The consensus of the Council was that the Municipal Auditorium gym should be available for public use and community events (such as vendor fairs and holiday events), but the City should restrict the use of bikes, scooters, tools and machinery, and large items that might damage the floor.

b. <u>Updates</u>: Swann reported the following: (i) the boilers had been inspected and received a good rating due to the diligence of City employee Myron Kinneberg; (ii) the pressure sewer extension project would be ready to proceed once Nancy and Gerald Kraus signed the agreement; (iii) Swann and Michael Gerardy, administrative coordinator, had met with Heather Myhre of the Houston County Health Department to revise the Walk Caledonia maps to limit the routes to sidewalks; (iv) the sidewalk in front of City Hall and the police station/ambulance building had been repaired; (v) the carpets had been cleaned in City Hall and the police station/ambulance building, with significant assistance from Myron Kinneberg and Karen Gran, who helped move the furniture; and (vi) the projected cost of upgrading the City's phone system had dropped from \$350/mo. to less than \$100/mo., following discussion and revision of the plans with AcenTek.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

a. <u>Assistant ambulance director position</u>: The Council discussed the future of the assistant ambulance director position with Ambulance Director Mike Tornstrom. The consensus of the Council was that with the full-time ambulance director starting on September 19, 2016, the assistant ambulance director's hours would be significantly reduced going forward—to approximately five hours a month. No further action was taken by the Council.

b. <u>Review of respectful workplace policy for City personnel and City Council members</u>: Member Burns updated Council on information the City had obtained from the League of Minnesota Cities and Houston County about restricting employees from carrying firearms while on duty or on City property. No further action was taken by the Council.

c. <u>Review of 2017 proposed general fund budget</u>: The Council reviewed and discussed the proposed 2017 budget for the general fund. By consensus the Council reduced the proposed budget for several line items, totaling \$8,000. No further action was taken by the Council.

NEW BUSINESS:

a. <u>Permit application to construct storage building on 520 S. Highway 44/76</u>: The Council reviewed an application from Steve Bauer to construct a storage facility at 520 S. Highway 44/76 in the City of Caledonia. Member Burns moved to approve the application, and Member Lemke seconded the motion. All members present voted in favor of the motion, and the motion passed.

b. <u>Authorization to allocate additional funding for street repair</u>: The Council discussed a request from Mike Gerardy, administrative coordinator, to allocate \$6,000-\$7,000 from the reserve fund to the 2016 budget for street repair so that the City could repair the curb line near Merchants Bank. Mayor Gran moved to approve the allocation of up to \$7,000 to the budget to repair the curb. The motion was seconded by Member Burns. All members present voted in favor of the motion, and the motion passed.

c. <u>Sponsorship of Wild Turkey Fest</u>: The Council discussed a request to contribute \$792 to the Wild Turkey Festival being held on October 22, 2016 and being organized by a group of Caledonia entities. Member Burns moved to allocate from \$500 from the Liquor Fund to the event, and Member Schroeder seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-1, with Mayor Gran voting no.

d. <u>Overtime report</u>: The Council reviewed the overtime report for the pay period August 15-28, 2016. The Council took no further action.

e. <u>Prepaid claims</u>: Council reviewed the prepaid claims for the period August 10, 2016-September 9, 2016. Member Burns moved to approve the prepaid claims listed below. The motion was seconded by Member Lemke. All members present voted in favor of the motion, and the motion passed.
