REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL CITY OF CALEDONIA, MINNESOTA Monday, January 11, 2016

CALL TO ORDER: Following due call and notice thereof, Mayor Gran called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Room of City Hall.

ROLL CALL: Members present: Mayor Joshua Gran, Council Members: Bob Lemke, DeWayne Schroeder, Bob Burns and Paul Fisch. City Staff Present: Interim City Clerk/Administrator Steve Schuldt, Guests: Steven Peplinski, Jeff Osgood from Kwik Trip and News Reporter, Zach Olson.

AGENDA: Motion by Member Schroeder, second by Member Fisch and the motion passed to approve the agenda.

CONSENT AGENDA APPROVAL: Member Burns moved, second by Member Lemke and motion passed to approve the consent agenda, which consisted of the minutes from the December 14, 2015 meeting, 2015 Pay Equity Report, 2015 League of Minn. Cities Property Casualty Dividend and Gambling Permit application for Caledonia Rod & Gun Club.

VISITORS AND COMMUNICATIONS: Jeff Osgood, Project Manager with Kwik Trip, presented plans for their soon to be constructed convenience store. Construction is expected to begin 3rd week in February for a 6,000 square foot building with kitchen & dining amenities in addition to convenience shopping. The facility will have 3 diesel pumping points in addition to 10 gas pumping points. Lighting will be LEED compliant and efforts will be made to limit light interfering with residences in the area. A storm water wet pond will be constructed to control runoff. The plan includes an access point to join Kwik Trip with Dollar General's property for customer convenience. The current sound system for music and announcements will be replaced with at-pump audio-video so as not to disturb neighbors. Kwik Trip has also committed to cost sharing for traffic lights, should MNDOT require them. Mr. Osgood anticipates the project to be completed in 3 to 4 months.

Steven Peplinski asked council members if they had read the Glover investigation. He questioned if charges would be brought against the past Clerk/Administrator in addition to the charges against himself. Mr. Peplinski states that he is being charged with violation of Ordinance 153.195 which doesn't exist. He states that Ordinance 153.195 (Dwelling Units Prohibited) which he interprets to mean that residential buildings cannot be in the industrial park. He questions if the City changes ordinances to make the charges fit. He complained that criminal charges are being filed against him and he is being accused of harassing due to his requests for public documents. However, he states things are better now that Councilman Burns is assisting in the records search. Peplinski then states that he is violating the ordinance every Friday and Saturday nights by allowing minors on the premises after 10:00 pm. He states that he is being charged with an ordinance violation that doesn't exist but isn't being charged for an ordinance violation that does. He questions if Mike Steele will be charged for 3 ordinance violations (bonding, excavation and nuisance). Mayor Gran suggested all council members review Kraig Glover's investigative report before making any judgments. Mr. Peplinski discussed codification of the city ordinances, including updating and clarification of certain sections. Mr. Peplinski states that certain ordinances are obscure and difficult to understand. He stated that Glover's report did not include issues of harassment stemming from his records requests to the city clerk's office. Peplinski expects laws to be applied equally to all individuals and mentioned an elderly lady with a home occupation next to the police station in which she lives on the first floor. He states that he is being charged criminally for a violation that should also be applied to the lady who owns the flower shop. Peplinski mentions that Joe Rud Trucking received a letter from Ted Schoonover questioning if there was living quarters in his truck shop but there was no evidence of follow-up with Mr. Rud. Peplinski continues to argue that he is not being charged with an ordinance violation due to allowing minors on premises after 10:00 pm but is being charged criminally for an ordinance violation that doesn't apply to him. He further comments that a criminal investigation turned over to Fillmore County has been returned to the Houston County Sheriff and then reassigned to Tim Erwin from the Hokah City Police. He understands that Erwin was a former part time police office with the Caledonia Police and believes there to be a conflict of interest with Erwin being the investigating officer. End of discussion.

The USAquatics timeline was reviewed. Contractor coordination meeting is planned for January 27, 2016. A probable cost estimate review by city staff is scheduled for January 20 with available contractors welcome to attend for discussion.

Hiring of part time police officer Samantha Lester effective 12-8-2015 was discussed. Members questioned the hiring of personnel prior to council approval. Member Fisch moved, second by Member Burns and the motion passed to approve the hiring of Samantha Lester. Member Fisch moved, second by Member Burns and the motion passed to allow Ms. Lester to participate in PERA.

An estimate from Midwest Installations, LLC to replace the auditorium basement floor for \$39,392.08 was discussed. It was the consensus of council that auditorium usage by the public did not warrant the cost of replacement. No action was taken.

The application of Barbara A. Peters for liquor store cashier was reviewed. Member Burns moved, second by Member Lemke and the motion passed to approve Ms. Peters.

The application of Christine Knutson for an EMT position was reviewed. It was noted that Ms. Knutson had been approved at the December 14, 2015 meeting without an application in council packets and that a vote was not necessary.

Member Burns briefly reviewed the pet ordinance regarding multiple pets with council and noted that there is a conflict with the wordage of kennel. In one part of the ordinance, a kennel is required to be used and in another, a kennel is considered a nuisance and shall not be kept or maintained within the city. Members discussed the situation and determined that this among other ordinances need to be reviewed and updated.

Members discussed attending the annual meeting of Southeastern Minnesota League of Municipalities and determined that no one would be available to attend.

Members discussed attendance by Nathan Becker to meter school and basic training in Marshall, Minnesota. Member Fisch moved, second by Member Lemke and the motion passed to approve attendance at meter school by Nathan Becker.

2016 committee and position appointments were reviewed by council. Members considered the need for a deputy city clerk. Member Burns suggested Jessica Kohnen or Dorothy Ranzenberger for the position. It was determined that Jessica handled more of the city business and was the stronger candidate. Appointment of City Attorney was discussed and determined that the firm Hammell & Murphy should be the appointment rather than one particular attorney. All other appointments remained the same. Member Burns moved, second by Member Fisch and the motion passed to approve the 2016 position, appointments and committees with the addition of Jessica Kohnen as Deputy Clerk and Hammell & Murphy being appointed to City Attorney.

Council was made aware that some residents and snow removal operators were pushing snow onto public highways and streets which can create a hazard. It was noted that violations are considered a misdemeanor and civil penalties can apply. No other action was taken.

Non association pay increases were discussed. Members determined that union police officers received an increase of 2.70% which should also go to Chief Zehnder. Library personnel are to receive 2.15%. Liquor store assistant manager is to receive 2.15% increase with store cashiers to remain the same but subject to the minimum wage increase to \$9.50 effective on August 1, 2016. Animal control is contractual and will remain the same. Forestry/Nursery is to remain the same at minimum wage. Athletic field manager/director will increase from \$12.25 to \$12.50 per hour and all other athletic field personnel to remain the same. Pool personnel wages are to remain the same. Member Burns moved, second by Member Lemke and the motion passed to approve the non-association wages as discussed.

Member Schroeder questioned what starting wage should be offered to the new librarian when hired. Council determined that the starting wage would be the 2015 hourly rate plus a 2.15% increase.

Council was made aware of employee health insurance rate increases with no action taken.

Prepaid claims were reviewed by council. Member Lemke moved, second by Member Burns and the motion passed to approve prepaid claims as presented.
