REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL CITY OF CALEDONIA, MINNESOTA Monday, May 12, 2014

CALL TO ORDER: Following due call and notice thereof, Mayor Burns called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Room, City Hall.

ROLL CALL: Members present: Mayor Bob Burns, Council Members: DeWayne Schroeder, Paul Fisch and Bob Lemke. Member Randi Vick was absent. City Staff Present: Administrative Coordinator Mike Gerardy, City Electrician Matt Blocker and City Clerk/Administrator: Ted Schoonover. Guests Jim Dierson, Star Energy representatives Chuck Gustafson and Tom Nigon and Caledonia Argus reporter Dianna Hammell.

AGENDA: Motion by Mayor Burns, second by Member Lemke to approve the agenda as amended. All voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

CONSENT AGENDA APPROVAL: Motion by Mayor Burns, second by Member Fisch to approve the consent agenda, which consisted of the regular meeting minutes from April 28, 2014 and corrected minutes from the Special meeting from April 16, 2014. All members present voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

VISITORS AND COMMUNICATIONS: Notice of a public hearing regarding a telecommunications tower for ATT to be held at the County Courthouse on May 22, 2014 at 7:45 p.m.

ADMINISTRATIVE COORDINATOR: Mike Gerardy stated that he had received a concern from a local resident about a person raising honey bees within the city limits and our ordinances do not address them as allowed or prohibited. Discussion ensued and the consensus was to watch the situation and if it becomes an issue we can address it at that time. He also brought up the subject of amending the ordinance when it comes to the sizes of garages allowed on certain properties. The consensus was to prepare a draft amendment to the ordinance and bring it back and we can move forward on the adoption process.

Mike Gerardy presented the council with a zoning variance request from Jim Dierson at 213 E. Lincoln St. He is adding onto his carport and enclosing it and requires a variance of 9' on the East property line. Motion by Mayor Burns, second by Member Lemke to approve the variance. All members present voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

Gerardy then presented the council with a building permit for Gary Kruckow to build a new storage shed at 404 Whose Lane. Motion by Mayor Burns, second by Member Lemke to approve the permit. All members present voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

Gerardy stated that he has another variance request that would require a public hearing and he requests that be held on May 27, 2014 at 6:15 p.m. Motion by Mayor Burns, second by Member Fisch to set the meeting for that date and time.

Gerardy then mentioned that in working with Davy Engineering regarding the Whose Lane wastewater and sewer issue and feels that we need to move forward with the original plan and develop a new agreement to begin the project moving forward. The consensus of the council was to get a new agreement developed and update the plan and bring it back for formal approval.

Motion by Mayor Burns, second by Member Schroeder to approve the Cooperative Agreement #05680 T.H. 44 Shared Used Path Construction. All members present voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

CTY ELECTRICIAN: Tom Nigon and Chuck Gustafson were in attendance to present several options for the Wild Turkey Substation project. There are basically three options. One for \$1,000,000 which is the lowest, another mid level option of \$1,300,000 and another for \$1,800,000. Star Energy stated they felt the middle one would allow the city to remain operational and a lower capacity if a widespread outage occurred and gives the city some redundancy. To move forward Dairyland Power would require a 30% down payment for the ordering of the transformer and they would act as the project manager and take care of the bids and specifications. They also mentioned that Caledonia is a high class utility and very reliable and is by far one the better electrical utilities around. Once this substation is completed the city would be set for at least 20 years and possibly up to 50 years. Motion by Mayor Burns, second by Member Lemke to authorized Star Energy to proceed with the planning and process of building the new substation and have Dairyland Power act as the consultant or project manager for the entire project. All members present voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

NEW BUSINESS: Administrator Schoonover presented the Tri-County electrical rates and the increase was very minimal at .0685. No action taken.

Schoonover presented the council with a proposal to purchase a new switch for city hall and another one for the police department. Both switches are damaged and need to be replaced to be more efficient. Motion by Member Schroeder, second by Member Fisch to approve the purchase. All members present voted on favor and the motion was declared carried.

Motion by Mayor Burns, second by Member Schroeder to approve the 4 day temporary liquor license for Caledonia City Celebrations for June 13-14, 2014. All members present voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

Motion by Mayor Burns, second by Member Lemke to approve the hiring of lifeguards Thomas Jergenson and Madelyn Strub at \$7.75 per hour and Kayla McCormick at her past wage of \$8.95 if she'll accept that wage. All members present voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

Motion by Mayor Burns, second by Member Lemke to approve part-time officers hiring of Justin Hesse, Cody Bellock, Zach Swedberg and Mike Rasmusson effective immediately. All members present voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.

An application was present for a firefighter to be hired. This applicant is leaving for the military in June of 2014 and the council felt it would be in the city's best interest to wait until he returns from his military training to hire him. No action was taken.

Motion by Mayor Burns, second by Member Fisch to approve the claims as presented. All members present voted in favor and the motion was declared carried.
